Dear Colleague

We have been approached by a production company who is keen to use one of our members for a documentary they want to make. They would like a service in the **Birmingham, Manchester, Leeds, Nottingham, Norwich areas**. This is a great opportunity for us to try to support them as they are addressing the recruitment challenge and showing young people how social care could be a viable option.

In brief, our new series will feature a small group of teenagers, aged 16-18, from around the UK who are trying to take their first tentative steps in the job market and decide if working is for them or if they should stay in full time education. Our understanding is that there are more people unemployed in this age range than any other and statistics show that sometimes it can take up to 30 applications to get one interview. The aim of the series is to equip our group with real life employment skills and practical experience from industry mentors who will help them to make an informed decision about their future career.

We want to find settings where there is either a skills shortage or a real growth in the industry and workers of our age group are welcomed. We'd like our small group of carefully selected teenagers to obtain some managed work experience in a Care Home because we know that there is a real need for workers in the sector, it can be a very personally rewarding job and it's not often a place where young people might traditionally think to look for work. We want our teens to gain a collection of skills that might help them with future employment opportunities but also give something back in the process.

In each work experience we would like them to do real tasks that they might be expected to do if they were working within a specific junior role at the company and we will take guidance from any of the businesses we approach about what roles would be appropriate and suitable for them to take part in. Over the series we hope each location will give them varied and much needed skills which will make them a valuable asset to any employers they apply to after they finish with us. This aspirational series will see the teenagers spend time at a number of employers and not only learn basic skills needed to thrive in that industry, but to also understand the lives of the people responsible for keeping these industries going.

The series has been commissioned by the BBC's children's department for older teenagers, is presented by Stacey Dooley and will be first broadcast on the BBC iplayer, a growing TV destination for this age group.

From a practical point of view, in terms of filming, we only need to film for 2 days per location. So if we are filming within one Care Home, we would only be there for two days. As mentioned above we would work closely with your teams to make sure that we are offering tasks that are appropriate, and that you are comfortable with. As we are venturing into "live" work places we want to minimise disruption to staff and residents and I just want to reassure you that as a production company we take full responsibility for the insurance, and health and safety of our group.

Currently our filming dates are either the week of July 16 (for two days) or the week of July 23rd. We are a small documentary team with small discreet cameras and the team are used to filming and being in environments which require a sensitive approach. We will have around 5 young people, and a production crew of 3.
